

Rosebud's Apron



Rosalie “Rosebud” Gerber of Lacey, Washington shares her new apron with us. Remember her wonderful dressed rubber chickens from the Summer 1997 Newsletter. Her apron is white with red trim, and holds a whole days supply of site gags. The pockets are specifically designed to hold each item. Most of these are oversized, which is what makes their appearance at a hospital so ridiculous and amusing. Rosebud uses these with adult patients at St. Peters Hospital in Olympia, Washington.

Here is a description of the apron contents:

- A large scissors to “cut hair and/or toenails,”
- A stethoscope with a toilet plunger and clowns noses,
- Two hearts, (both the stress relief squeeze ball type)
 - One is realistic looking, the other symbolic for a “One looks well, and one is sick” routine.
- A giant thermometer, feather duster, and large syringe,
- A large tooth brush and a large comb,
- A large knife and fork, “May I can join you for lunch?”
- A cat puppet for “Cat Scans”
- A moaning back scratcher
- Small doctor’s bag for stickers
- Squeaky hammer for a knee jerks and bopping.
- A breakfast pizza with a fried egg on top,
 - which can double as “egg on your face.”
